
Apprenticeships employer newsletter: South Central

National Apprenticeship Awards 2013 Winners Case Study

Elements, a hair and beauty salon based in Oxted Surrey, was founded over 30 years ago by its Director, Barbara McNaughton. Through offering Apprenticeships, it has grown into a thriving business with an academy for training young people. "We've taken on apprentices to train as

hairdressers for the last 20 years," says Barbara. "However, in the last ten years we've changed how Apprenticeships work with the company, and we're using them to grow a team passionate about improving and developing the business." Elements offers Intermediate and Advanced Apprenticeships in Hairdressing, Barbering, Customer Service, Team Leading and Business and Administration. Out of its 24 staff, ten are apprentices, and the company's in-house academy also trains apprentices for other businesses. Barbara believes that the training apprentices receive is the best way of providing the right skills for her workforce. "Apprenticeships have always been the best route for hairdressers, as when the apprentices learn skills they implement them immediately in the workplace, and this keeps motivation and enthusiasm high. The strength for our business is consistency in customer service and buy-in

to our ethos. Without Apprenticeships,

people would be coming in with their own skillset in isolation - with Apprenticeships, everyone is connected to each other and what we're doing as a business. The apprentices are the heart of the team." Elements has achieved recognition for its Apprenticeships, including being named Small Employer of the Year in the South Central region by the National Apprenticeship Service in both 2012 and 2013, as well as being highly commended at the national final of the National Apprenticeship Awards in 2013. Barbara plans to keep employing and training apprentices, with the hope that Elements may offer Higher Apprenticeships in the future. In the meantime, the business continues

In the meantime, the business continues to champion Apprenticeships in the local area by holding demonstrations at skills shows and working with the local MP among other initiatives.

"Many business owners don't realise the support available to help and inspire small business to take on apprentices, such as help with recruitment through the National Apprenticeship Service's online Apprenticeship vacancies service, as well as grants for small employers," says Barbara. "Apprenticeships offer a win-win situation all round, both for the apprentices and also for businesses."

Apprenticeship Ambassador Appointed

Jason Holt has been appointed as the Small Business Apprenticeship Ambassador, a new role appointed by the Minister of State for Skills and Enterprise, Matthew Hancock, and supported by the National Apprenticeship Service.

In his role Jason will advise on how best to engage with smaller businesses and help increase the number, quality, impact and reach of Apprenticeships.

He will also act as an advocate for the benefits of high quality Apprenticeships for businesses and individuals, work closely with the Apprenticeship Ambassador Network and help to raise the profile of Apprenticeships in England.

Jason was asked to head up a Government review in February 2012 on Making Apprenticeships More Accessible
to SMEs. Since the publication of the report the NAS have implemented the majority of the proposals, including the production of a dedicated More Accessible
to SMEs.

Apprenticeship Grant for Employers of 16 to 24 year olds (AGE 16 to 24)

AGE 16 to 24 is aimed at supporting businesses to grow by employing young people through the Apprenticeship programme.

Employers that:

- have up to 1,000 employees;
- haven't started an apprentice in the past 12 months; and
- want to take on an apprentice (or apprentices) aged 16 to 24;

may be able to get a grant of £1,500 per apprentice from the National Apprenticeship Service. This is in addition to the training costs of the Apprenticeship which are met in full for young people aged 16 to 18 and partly funded for those aged 19 and over.

The Grant is available until 31 December 2014, subject to eligibility and availability. Could it help you too?

Traineeships

A Traineeship is an education and training programme with work experience that is focused on giving young people the skills and experience that employers are looking for. At its core are work preparation training, English and maths for those who need it, and a high quality work experience placement.

Traineeships are very flexible, and by working closely with a training organisation you can design a programme which suits your needs and those of the trainee.

Two hundred early years apprentices will benefit from an increased bursary of $\mathfrak{L}3,000$ (up from $\mathfrak{L}1,500$), with a further $\mathfrak{L}300$ available for training and study as part of the Government's drive to attract high-quality candidates to the profession. Announced in May 2013, the bursaries are available to those taking part in an early years Apprenticeship scheme; the first 200 successful applicants to the bursary scheme will secure the increased award of $\mathfrak{L}3,000$.

To be eligible, applicants will need to secure an Apprenticeship position, for example in a nursery, school nursery, or children's centre that delivers the early learning places for two-year-olds, and hold at least a GCSE at grade C or above in English and maths.

The scheme, which is run by the National College for Teaching and Leadership (NCTL), is now open for applications. Apprenticeships are expected to take an average of 20 months to complete, and will consist of employment and study to gain recognised qualifications through various routes, including further education colleges.
